ORDINANCE NO. 2013-2

IN THE MATTER OF THE ADOPTION OF THE PROWERS COUNTY, COLORADO
FLOODPLAIN DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
PROWERS COUNTY, COLORADO:

The Board of County Commissioners of Prowers County, Colorado, pursuant to Colorado law, is vested with the authority of administering the affairs of Prowers County, Colorado, and

The State of Colorado has adopted standards for floodplain management, and citizens of Prowers County may participate in the National Flood Insurance Program which includes flood insurance, hazard mitigation funding and other state and federal flood damage assistance,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Prowers County, Colorado as follows:

The Board of County Commissioners of Prowers County, Colorado hereby adopts the Prowers County, Colorado Floodplain Damage Prevention Ordinance, a true copy of which Ordinance in its entire text was submitted in writing to the Board of County Commissioners of Prowers County, Colorado before such adoption, and which may be inspected at the office of the County Clerk and Recorder of Prowers County, Colorado.

After final adoption of this Ordinance, any person who commits a violation of this Ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day such violation continues shall be deemed a separate violation. In addition, Prowers County shall have the right to seek an injunction or other equitable relief in the Prowers County, Colorado District or County Court to terminate any violation of this Ordinance and of any acts prohibited herein and to recover its attorney fees and costs for such legal proceedings.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Board that if any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held or

determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

The above and foregoing Ordinance No. 2013-2 was, on motion duly made and seconded, adopted by the Board of County Commissioners this 12th day of December, 2013, and ordered published.
